

## **MEAT-FREE MENU**



## **ALL ABOUT BEES**

As they travel between flowers searching for nectar to eat, bees pick up and carry pollen. Pollen needs

to be taken from one flower to another for plants to grow seeds and fruit.

Bee numbers are falling around the world. Habitat loss and the use of pesticides are two of the reasons bees are struggling.

Bees help to pollinate more than 100 important (and tasty) fruit and vegetable plants, including beans, apples and blueberries.

There are more than 250 types of bee in the UK alone! These range from fuzzy bumblebees to slim honeybees.

Honeybees let one another know where the best food is by doing a 'waggle dance'. When a bee returns to the hive it waggles its body to show other bees which direction the food is in.



#### WHAT CAN YOU DO TO HELP?

 Look at websites of environmental organisations such as Friends of the Earth and RSPB. You can get bee saver kits from them, learn how to make your own bee hotel and join online campaigns to ban pesticides that harm bees.

- Get your parents to check that they don't use plant sprays that are harmful to bees.
  - Plant bee-friendly flowers such as lupins, foxgloves and lavender and herbs such as rosemary and marjoram.
  - -Grow plants like snowdrops and primroses, which flower in winter and spring – times when it can be hard for bees to find food.
  - Leave out a shallow bowl of water for thirsty bees to drink from.






Learn how to draw a pangolin by following the steps below.
